7. Old Business

- a. Update on Rick Pfister Memorial Fund project in Children's Department-Post has been painted and detailed to look like a tree. Most of the green disks have been installed on the ceiling to represent the leaves. We're still waiting for more details to be added.
- b. August Used Book Sale: Sue Smithmeyer and Sharon Mix-May not have to purchase snacks because we still have some from last time. Sign up sheet went around for shifts before, during and after the sale. Suggestion was made to also put a flyer up at Midland Bank and the Y.
- c. Results of Panera Fundraiser: Jay and Ronda Githens-Very positive response from community. Nancy mentioned that she spoke to one of the workers at Panera and they said it was the most successful fundraiser they've had and they welcome us back. Note: The check was waiting for us after the meeting.
- d. Report and recommendations from Murder Mystery committee: Kathi, Jay, Judy Somerlot-See attachment.

Kathi reached out to other libraries that have done it. They kept it pretty low key and simple. They purchased the script and the library staff were the clue givers. They had 62 people and it lasted about 2 hours after hours. Recommended that we purchase a kit for about \$45 and ask for donations for snacks. Maybe get a local theater group to assist. If it's going to be after hours, the board has to approve. Teresa, Judy and Carolyn volunteered BUT

We need someone to chair this committee. Because this is our first time doing this, we can make our own rules and figure out what works for us.

e. Report and recommendations from Membership committee: Kathi, Peggy, Sharon Mix See attachment. Some discussion about the senior rate for 65+ going down to \$5. Will we lose money vs bringing in new members for a low price. That will probably be removed and we will stick with a student rate of \$5, \$12 for other individuals, and \$20 for family. Kathi and Sue have created brochures for our September membership drive. We want to add them to each person's checkout and by the counter so we will have to decide on how many to print and the most sensible way to get the printing done.

- f. Report on Independence Day Parade: Kathi-Ten of us showed up and walked. Lots of positive interactions with the crowd. We ran out of beads and bookmarks. Sue made a suggestion to give away little bookmarks with crayons showing our logo to represent our group better than beads. She showed us samples of what she was talking about and had a very positive response from the members. She also had a suggestion of bracelets with our logo.
- g. Purchase of meeting room chairs: cost update and recommendation-Friends received a \$3000 anonymous donation exclusively for the chairs. After some discussion between the Friends officers, the Friends will donate an additional \$2,000 for a total donation of \$5,000. Jay moved, Judy seconded. All approved.

8. New Business

- a. Volunteering in the Children's Department-lots of low stress opportunities available. Jennette would love to have the help. Mike could also use help in the adult department. If you can spare a couple of hours and do easy stuff like dust shelves, they would love to have you.
- b. Updating the web page establish ad hoc committee. Mike brought up there's not a lot of traffic to the website outside of the catalog and events page. Friends may benefit from having a separate website that the library would link to on their site. There are ways to get it hosted for free. WordPress and Google were both mentioned. Jay, Ronda and Theresa volunteered to look more into this.
