### 6. Library Activities

- a. Shelley Augustine:
  - a.i. Board meeting tonight will include Eagle Scout project presentation on building a food bank at the library. Friends are expected to take over and manage. Because of that the Friends would like the Eagle Scout to come and present to the group and answer questions of details, expectations, etc.
  - a.ii. Update on IMLS: Temp restraining order has been granted to stop defunding efforts. There is a handout available at the front desk detailing the services that are affected by the IMLS defunding. It is also available electronically.
  - a.iii. This past year, in person checkouts at the library was up 7.8%. Digital checkouts up 17.9%. Events and programs increased 37% with increased attendance at those events as well.
  - a.iv. Library will probably have the same budget next year.
  - a.v. More staff members have been certified to register voters.

- a.vi. Discussion with local officials about using library space as an alternative venue for court offices during an emergency. YPL would be one of a few different options for the courts. This would not be a criminal court setting.
- a.vii. Misc. Chiller is operational. Spring clean up was successfully completed this past weekend.

- b.i. IMLS (cont) One of the ways to show the importance of libraries in our lives is to tell people's stories. Mike relayed a story he received about someone who was painfully shy and nervous and decided to try out our Dungeons and Dragons group. And now this person has friends that share their interests and has opened up a new world to them.
- b.ii. The final Fox River presentation was a big success with about 60 people showing up. They would like to do more next year and are open to ideas for new topics.

- b.v. Battle of the Books had very good social engagement on FB. Over 200 people participated. Library plans to increase their FB, IG and TikTok presence.
