### 5. Library Activity:

- Shelley
  - An Eagle scout will present his idea for a mini food pantry in the Library to the Library Board tonight. Measurements have been taken and guidelines for esthetics noted. Suggested using casters so it could be moved if necessary. Some concerns were mentioned by FYL members regarding the type of items to be included and how it will be maintained.
  - The chiller will be started on Monday 4/21.
  - Replaced a pump in the boiler for the third time. There has been a charge for only the first replacement
  - The Federal Government has eliminated the department that provided funds to museums and libraries. A few things that may be effected are grants, RAILS program, Illinois Libraries Presents. Illinois Representatives have been contacted. The American Library Association web site offers "Show up for Libraries." Twenty plus states have filed a law suit against the Federal Government. A suggestion was made to make information available in the

Library lobby. This could be too political. Shelley will ask the Board if this could be done.

- Tablescape Program earned just short of \$1800 through tickets and donations.
  Approximately 160 people attended. A wrap up meeting will be held and discussion on what can be done for next year. Possibly this event could be coordinated on the same weekend as the High School Spring Craft Show
- UDEMY database has been well received. A Board trustee used the database to complete required hours for a job which saved a lot of money

- Computer classes for seniors will begin on April 25<sup>th</sup>
- Battle of the Books continues. Voting is down to the last three books.
- Another order for Library Logo shirts can be submitted. Mike would need to have any requests by April 30<sup>th</sup>.
